AES CONFERENCE ANNOUNCEMENT AND SECOND CALL FOR PAPERS

The Agricultural Economics Society's 88th annual conference will be held at AgroParisTech, Paris, from Wednesday 9th to Friday 11th of April, 2014. **The entire conference will be in English**, catering will be provided at the venue during the day and there will be the usual conference dinner held locally on Thursday 10th April. Delegates can book accommodation through the Secretariat or use the list of local hotels provided to book their own. Day 1 of the programme will be a joint meeting between AES and SFER, with the theme: **Challenges for European Agriculture in the Context of Climate Change**

Days 2 and 3 of the conference will include keynote speakers, symposia, contributed papers, discussion papers and poster sessions; the conference dinner will take place in a central Paris location and there will be an organised post conference event – updates to the programme will be available on the AES website.

Sessions open to submissions

Contributed Papers : papers that present completed work, or research in a relatively advanced state of completion.

Discussion Papers : papers that explore new ideas and approaches or that address issues relating to the more formative stages of a research project.

Poster Papers : work more suited to a less formal form of presentation, for example, PhD research.

The Society is again keen to encourage postgraduates and those in postdoctoral positions and in recognition of this there is a £200 prize for the best poster paper presented by an early career researcher.

Candidates will be assessed on the quality of their discussion paper or poster proposals and the submission of a short case for support.
